## Art from the Heart Legacy Program



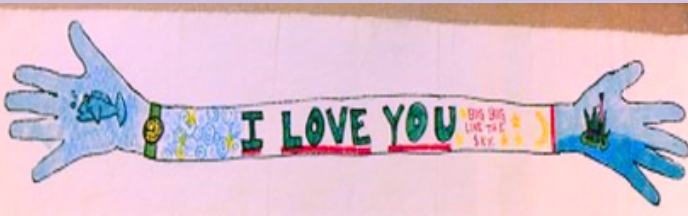
Families find value in participating in projects with residents, sharing and reminiscing about their lives, and having a special memento after their loved one's death.

## Available Projects

These are a few samples of what we offer - please ask for the Legacy Binder to see all of the Art from the Heart projects currently available.

### Hug Wrap



We trace the hands and arms of a resident on soft fleece, which can then be decorated. When completed, it will wrap cozily around the person for whom it's made.

### Holding Hands Photo



Staff will photograph the resident holding hands with their loved one. The photograph is then printed in black and white and framed.



### Fingerprint Family Tree

Residents and families can create a special family tree made up of the fingerprints of each family member. When complete, the final print is framed for the family to take home.

### Heart Song



A resident's heartbeat is recorded with a special stethoscope, and our Music Therapist creates a song using the recording as the drumbeat.

## Customized Stuffie



Residents can record a special message or their heartbeat for their loved one on a device that is stitched into a stuffed animal. There are backpacks and crocheted bags to place cards or mementos into which can then be attached to the stuffie.

### Holding Hands Mold



This is a beautifully sculptured plaster replica of a resident's hands, either on their own, or holding the hand of a loved one.
